Acknowledgements, bibliographic sources, and persons named as sources are not indexed even if mentioned in the body of the text, except where the source is of a historic nature relevant to an indexed aspect of York (e.g. Daniel Defoe's descriptions of 18thc. York).

Volume numbers are in bold type.

Medieval surnames beginning with prefixes (e.g. de, la) are indexed under the main element of the name. Names have predominantly been indexed as they appear in the text except where inconsistent spellings may lead to the reader missing an entry. In these cases, names are cross-referenced or both spellings are given under the modern entry.

Institutions, streets, churches etc. are indexed directly unless they are outside York, in which case they are subsumed under the place name: e.g. Beverley

St Mary's Church

Passing references to places other than York are not indexed except when they constitute the primary subject of an article, e.g. the Harrogate Civic War Memorial (14:62-71) indexed under "Harrogate". Similarly, people not directly connected with York are not indexed individually, e.g. the names of individual prisoners captured during the 1745 Jacobite Rebellion and brought to York Castle to face trial are indexed as a sub heading "rebel prisoners" under "Jacobite Rebellion".

Qualifiers after entries in the index:

Personal names have been qualified by occupation and dates, where available. Events are dated where possible, and places accorded approximate dates for the period covered. The object is to 'locate' the reference as an aid to the reader in their search and should not be taken as definitive. Dates may refer to birth or death, period of office, date of the event mentioned or simply the nearest date in the text with which the entry is

associated. Where a reference is to a long period of time or a general comment on an aspect of the subject, a period (century or centuries) is given if appropriate.
